I commend the teachers on the responsive “on line learning programs” and “on line learning packs” developed, our commitment to high quality teaching and learning is clearly evident.

Thank you to all the parents who took the time to return our online survey, we are incorporating your feedback into our decision-making processes. At this stage if term two starts with KI and South Australia in a similar situation with Covid 19, 44% of parents are indicating they will send their children to school. We totally understand many of you are combining home schooling with working outside the home, working at home or caring for younger children. Just do the best you can, that is all we are asking. The key is to keep in weekly contact with your child’s class or subject teacher.

At this stage the general bus runs and the intercampus bus runs will continue as normal. The intercampus subjects will also continue as normal with students traveling between sites.

Take care and stay well this holiday season. I look forward to a time when we can come together again as a group but until then there is still much to be grateful for in our families, our school and our wider community.
