What is the SACE?

- SACE - South Australian Certificate of Education
- Recognised nationally and internationally
- A qualification for entry into universities and further training
- Requirements for many jobs and employment opportunities

How does the SACE work?

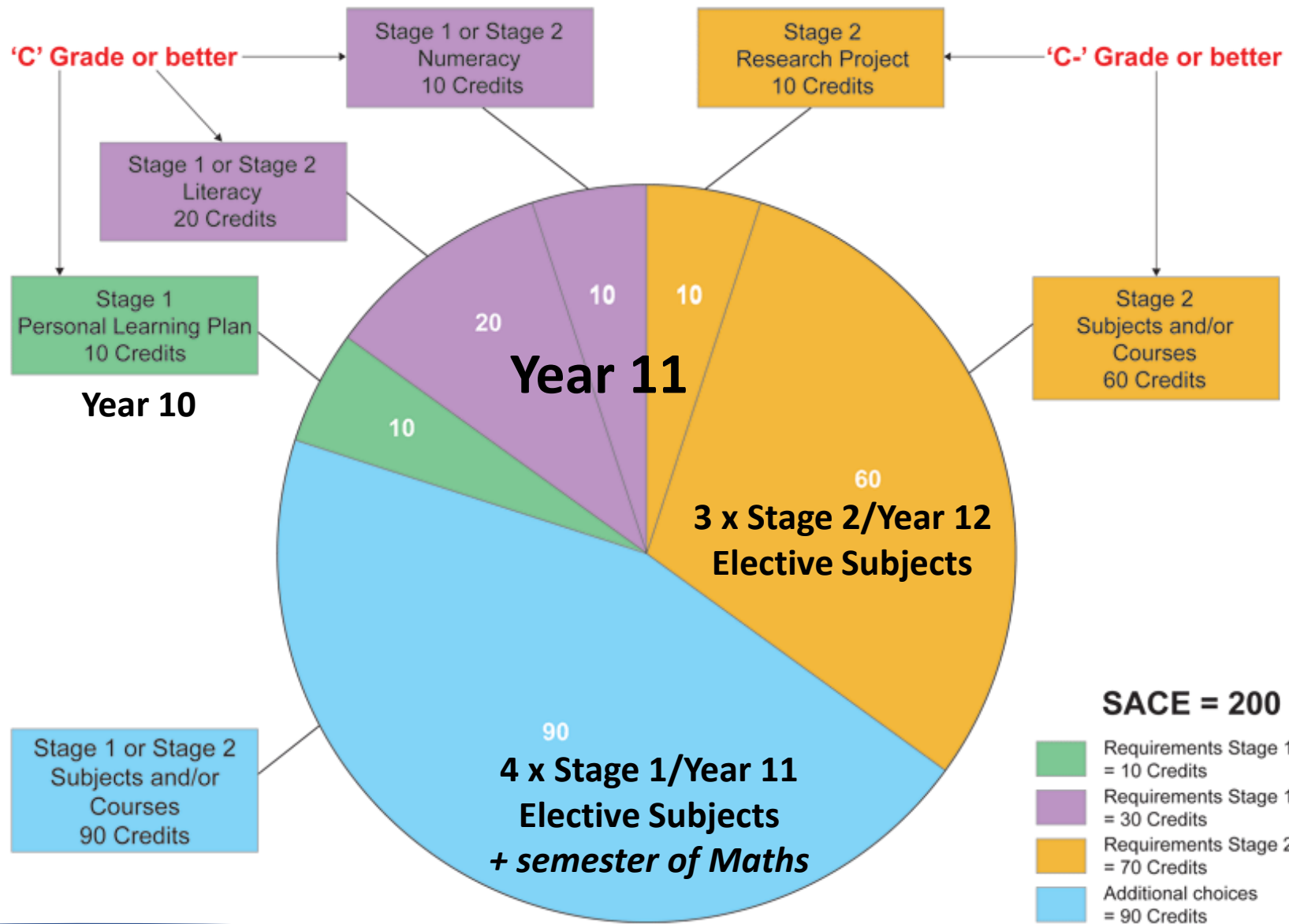
There are two 'stages' of the SACE certificate:

- Stage 1 is generally completed in Year 11
- Stage 2 is generally completed in Year 12
- Students need a total of 200 credits to achieve the SACE
- Students receive credits for completing each semester of a subject.

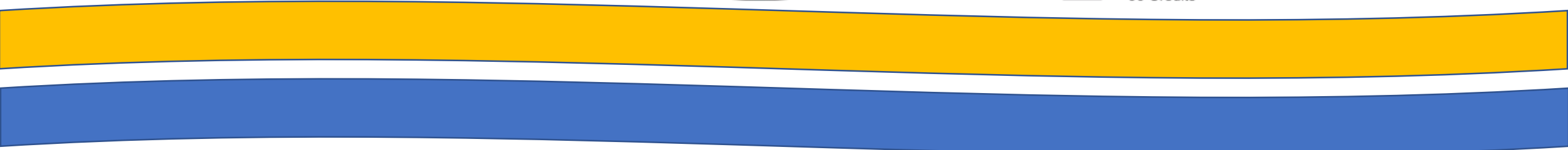

• Most 10-credit subjects are studied over 1 semester

• 20-credit subjects are studied over 2 semesters



SACE Completion Requirements

- **SACE Completion**

- **Year 11** – 4 subjects **PLUS** the compulsory requirements of;
 - Activating Identifies & Futures (*AIF*)
 - Literacy (*Essential English or English*)
 - Numeracy (*Essential Maths, General Maths or Mathematical Methods*)
- **Year 12** - 3 subjects in Year 12 (Stage 2)
 - Including *AIF* in completed in Year 11

- **SACE Completion & ATAR University Pathway**

- 4 subjects in Year 12 (Stage 2)
- + AIF (completed in Year 11)

- **For students to achieve their SACE, they must achieve;**

- a **C** grade or higher for all compulsory Stage 1 requirements
 - a **C-** grade or higher for all Stage 2 requirements
- 

Flexible Pathways – SACE Completion

- **The SACE is flexible, and caters for learning both in and outside of school**
 - Students can receive credit for SACE subjects, vocational training, community learning.
 - Community Recognised Learning - Duke of Edinburgh's International Award program, CFS, Umpiring (badged) and Army Cadets.

- Many students complete their SACE using VET Learning and achievement
- Students can combine study and part-time work via a school-based traineeship or apprenticeship (SBAT)

School Based-Apprenticeships & Traineeships (SBATs)

- The training you do as part of your School Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship (SBAT) can also count towards your SACE
 - An SBAT gives you the unique opportunity to combine VET training, with an employment contract whilst still completing your SACE.
 - SBATS are generally highly valued by employers and are a valid pathway for students to **transition** from school to employment, further training or higher education.
 - Students may choose to start this process in Year 10, 11 or 12



University and TAFE admission

To be considered for university admission as a school leaver applicant, normally you must;

- Meet the requirements of SACE (including compulsories)
- Obtain a sufficient ATAR/Selection Rank for entry to preferred course(s)
 - Completed the SACE with at least 4 subjects + AIF at Stage 2/Year 12
- Satisfy any prerequisites for the preferred course(s)

To be considered for TAFE admission as a school leaver applicant, normally you must;

- SACE completion meets the course admission requirements for most TAFE SA courses
 - There are some additional requirements for entry into particular qualification levels.


Open Access



Subject Selections

- Year 11 – study 6 subjects to study over the year + the Research Project
 - Includes; a Literacy (2 Semesters) and Numeracy subject (Semester)
 - Year 12 (ATAR Pathway) – study at least 4 subjects to study over the year
 - ATAR is calculated of the best 5 subjects
 - Activating Identifies & Futures is often the student's 5th subject
 - 90 credits for entry and at C- or higher
 - Year 12 (SACE Completion) – study at least 3 subjects to study over the year
 - 60 credits for completion at C- or higher
 - Activating Identifies & Futures at C- or higher
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Week 8 (12th September) – Individual Subject Confirmation

- Student/Parent/Teacher Counselling – can occur face to face or via phone
- Bookings will be via online booking system
- Senior Years Leaders to be involved in the process

Wednesday – Year 10 -> 11 (Kingscote)

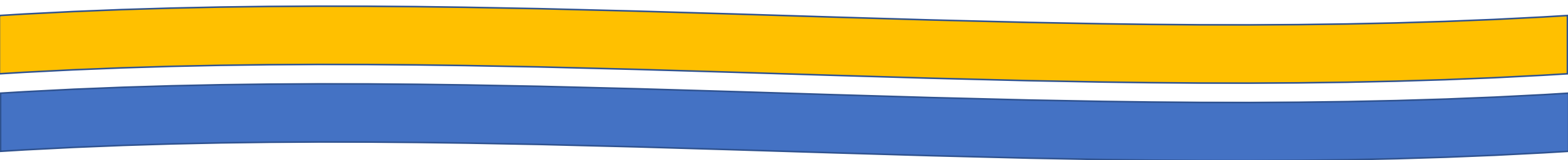
